## NA KANAWAI NUI NO KA ʻAINA O LILIʻUOKALANI Rules and Polices for Use of Kahakai Campgrounds

The Trustees of Liliʻuokalani Trust have set aside this site for the benefit and enjoyment of Hawaiian/Part-Hawaiian children. The rights and well being of our beneficiaries and their families using the ʻaina should be carefully observed. Aloha and all the courtesy it stands for is the main Kanawai Nui.

For our beneficiaries and their families using the ʻaina, the responsibility for and supervision of our beneficiaries rests with their parents or guardians who accompany them. **Minors must be supervised at all times.** Please exercise common sense and courtesy while sharing the ʻaina with others.

### The Following Constitutes the Na Kanawai Nui No Ka ʻAina O Liliʻuokalani:

- 1. On day of arrival, check-in and pick-up the gate transmitter at 74-5533 Luhia Street, Suite #100, Kailua Kona, HI 96740 (Kona International Market in Old Industrial Area). Office hours: 8am to 4pm, Mon – Fri. On day of departure, drop off gate transmitter, parking permit, and Lawaiʻa Report into the mail slot in the office door (by 4pm). Unreturned property will result in suspension of camping privileges. For those arriving on weekends or holidays, call (808) 238-3120 to check-in. You must check-in between 8am – 11am on these days.**
- 2. Campsite capacity & ratio:** 1 registered child = 4 guests, 2 registered children = 5 guests, 3 registered children = 7 guests (maximum of 10, **ONLY** if your ohana meets the child to guest ratio)
- 3. Only individuals listed on the Arrival Report are allowed on the premises.**
- Liliʻuokalani Trust property at the Kahakai Campgrounds is to be used strictly for recreational purposes without compensation to the Trust as camping grounds are for beneficiaries, their families, and their guests, or other designated Agency use.
- Please **respect all graves, artifacts and archaeological sites.** Please do not damage, remove, or destroy any artifacts or sites that are found. Please notify QLT staff as soon as possible if an artifact is discovered or a site becomes damaged in any way.
- Please remember to **remove and take out everything that you bring in, including trash.** We do not supply trash containers or bins.
- Alcoholic beverages, the possession or use of illegal drugs, gambling, and other illegal activities are prohibited on Trust property.
- Firearms (including pellet, b-b guns, air rifles, and pneumatic spear guns), fireworks or other incinerate-able material are prohibited on Trust property. Hunting or trapping of animals is prohibited.

9. **Bonfires are prohibited.** Campfires are not allowed on lawn area. They are only allowed in designated areas where fire pits and barbecue grills are provided. As a precaution:
  - a. Maintain a 10-foot radius, clear of burnable material, around the campfire.
  - b. Keep campfire under control at all times, with water or sand on hand in case of emergency.
  - c. Campfires should always be monitored by an adult and never left unattended. Please extinguish fire completely after use.
  - d. Use only dead materials, i.e., twigs or leaves on the ground, for firewood. Campers are to provide their own fuel (charcoal, wood).
  - e. The burning of wooden pallet racks is prohibited.
10. Please do not damage plants or trees on the property. Do not hammer nails into trees when setting up your campsites; you may secure tents and tarps by tying rope or twine to tree trunks, branches or stones. Please remember to remove and take with you all rope or twine or other materials that you use before leaving the campsite.
11. **No pets** or other animals are allowed on the premises.
12. Fishing is allowed only in the ocean (not the anchialine ponds). **Please take only what your family will eat during your stay.**
  - a. After fishing, **please fill out the Lawai‘a Report** as part of our on-going study towards marine stewardship.
  - b. Do not clean and dispose of fish waste in swimming areas.
  - c. Please use caution when fishing.
13. All ponds located within the Halepa‘o Campgrounds are off limits, except when accompanied by QLT staff.
14. **Only one (1) vehicle per campsite is permitted.** Extra vehicles are required to park in the Pono Parking lot. Display the parking permit on the rear-view mirror of each vehicle. Vehicles are to be operated by licensed individuals and are not to be driven on the campsites. All terrain vehicles (ATVs), dirt bikes, motor scooters, etc. are prohibited.
  - a. Adhere 15 miles per hour speed limit within Trust property. Keiki at play.
  - b. Park only in areas designated as parking areas (5 stalls at Halepa‘o and 3 stalls at Hi‘iakanoholae).
15. Please clean utensils in designated areas. Keep campsites clean.
16. Lua facilities are located at each camp kipuka. Campers are expected to use them to help safeguard the sanitation of the camps. Halepa‘o has a composting toilet facility to help conserve precious wai (water) and to re-use the byproduct to create nutrient rich soil. Please kokua and **do not throw anything into composting toilets besides toilet paper and composting wood shavings.**

17. Each family is limited to 2 reservations per year
18. Camping is authorized only in designated areas.
19. Please do not remove picnic tables from camp areas.
20. The campgrounds will be **closed every Tuesday and Wednesday** to allow replenishment and maintenance procedures to occur.
21. Suggestions to Queen Lili'uokalani Trust representatives regarding modification to the campsites or ideas on how to make your camping experience more enjoyable are welcome.

The above rules and conditions are to protect and preserve the ʻāina and to ensure the peaceful enjoyment for all who share the ʻāina now and into the future.
